In keeping with Arrowhead's policy of Sustainable Agriculture *and* Sustainable Community, the following guidelines for gardening at the Farm will be maintained.
Please read and initial to show that you are willing to work with us.

_____ Seed – We strongly recommend domestically produced seeds from the following sources: Johnny's Selected Seed, High Mowing, Territorial Seeds, Vermont Bean Seed, Baker Creek, Pine Tree Gardens, and Abundant Life

_____ 2010 season only – you may purchase seeds from other sources

_____ Saved or self-harvested tomato seed is not allowed. May carry phytopthera (late blight).

_____ Seed potatoes must be **certified!!** Non-certified potatoes may carry phytopthera (late blight) we will need to see a receipt for certified seed potatoes.

_____ Vegetable transplants must be homegrown or grown by local farms or greenhouses. Some we recommend are Nunan Greenhouses, The Herb Farmacy, Dunn Farm, Cider Hill Farm or here at Arrowhead. Cannot have “Grown in Canada” on them.

_____ Absolutely no transplants from Home Depot, Lowe’s, WalMart, Agway, K-Mart, or other non-growers and importers will be allowed.
